


FY 2010 Services

After School Programs/Teen REACH <i>Provides a structured environment for youth ages 6 to 17, to motivate their development of educational skills, and positive peer relationships.</i>	168 youth served
Substance Abuse Prevention <i>In partnership with Rock Island/Milan School District #41 to address the needs of youth at risk of using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs of abuse.</i>	1,869 students
Summer Day Camp <i>Provides activities to youth in the form of structured recreation, creative projects, and field trips when school is recessed for the summer.</i>	276 youth served
S.H.A.R.E. Food <i>The Self-Help And Resource Exchange allows The King Center to serve as a host site offering a co-op food-purchasing program available to the community. Interested residents pay a fee for a one-month allotment of food valued up to twice the amount.</i>	902 residents served
A.C.T.I.V.E. Club <i>Aging Citizens Taking Interest in a Variety of Experiences; provides opportunities for Senior residents to participate in social and volunteer activities.</i>	103 members served
Computer Classes <i>The classes are provided at no cost in an effort to improve community capacity to make effective use of information technology. The community is welcomed to sign up for courses that instruct on the basic parts of the computer and basic to advanced use of common business software.</i>	93 people served
Workforce Center <i>Provides easy access to information about employment opportunities, job training & placement</i>	839 people served
Tax Return Service <i>In partnership with the Center for Economic Progress, qualified individuals and families receive tax return services</i>	1,246 people served with 704 returns filed
Lockhart Scholarship <i>Scholarships for college bound students from Rock Island High School.</i>	4 students served
