9. Discounted Rates for Iowa PGA/GHIN Handicapping System

Pass Rules

- Passes are valid for Greens Fees only. Carts may be rented at an additional charge.
- Unlimited Passes are Valid 7 days per week. Limited Passes are valid Monday-Friday only.
- Limited Pass holders can play on weekends or holidays for a discounted upgrade fee.
- Pass Holders will have their picture taken and be given a Pass Card. Pass Holders must present their card to the clubhouse attendant before golfing.
- Passes are valid thru December 31st, 2025. Highland Springs is typically open from late March/early April through mid-November (Weather Permitting). Saukie is open from late March/early April through November on regular greens. From December through March Saukie is open periodically on temporary greens.

Highland Springs and Saukie Policies

U.S.G.A. rules govern all play

Local Rules

- No outside alcoholic beverages or coolers can be brought on property at any time.
- Course rangers and starters have full authority to enforce course rules and regulations.
- Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.
- Each player must have their own bag and clubs. No club sharing.
- No play is allowed without checking in at pro shop.
- No starting on the back nine without permission from the pro shop.
- Staff reserves the right to fill groups of less than four players.
- Carts must stay at least 30 feet from tees and greens and follow all markings and roped off areas without exception.
- All golfers must be off the course at or before sunset.

The Park and Recreation Board assumes no risk nor liability for accidents or property damage to, by, or from any person while on premises.

Dress Code

These regulations are in effect on both the golf course and the driving range at all times:

- Appropriate shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.
- Shirts should extend to the waist.
- Sleeveless shirts are allowed as long as the sleeve areas are finished and not torn out.
- No bathing suits or tops will be allowed.
- No item of clothing should have any profanity or offensive slogans, logos, pictures, or content.
- Golf shoes or flat bottom tennis shoes only; soft spikes mandatory.
- All players agree to the above rules when purchasing a pass, greens fee, or range balls.
- Staff reserves the right to remove or refuse service to those not abiding by the dress code.

Golf Cart Rules

To rent and operate a golf cart at either golf course, the person must be at least 18 years of age and have a valid driver's license or state issued ID. The renter must sign an agreement that holds them liable for damages and other penalties should there be a problem. This is standard throughout the golf industry. No person may drive a cart that has been rented by another person if they do not meet these guidelines.

Age Limits

Golf Patron Age Guidelines

For the safety of younger players and other golf patrons, the City of Rock Island Parks & Recreation Department has adopted the following guidelines:

- Minimum age to play unsupervised is nine at Saukie, 11 at Highland Springs. Child may play with parent or other adult at age six at Saukie, age eight at Highland Springs. Children who are (or have been) enrolled in a recognized Junior Program may qualify to play unsupervised at an earlier age if certified by a PGA professional as capable of handling this responsibility. All children under the minimum age not playing in a Parks supervised league or activity must be accompanied by a parent or other adult. An older sibling does not qualify if under 18 years of age.
- Children four and above may walk (or ride) along with adults upon payment of a walker fee (\$2 for kids under 18). Walk alongs are not players but will be allowed to putt or hit an occasional shot if properly supervised. If, in the judgment of the course personnel, the walk along or ride along is really a player, they will be asked to provide a greens fee receipt. The adult with the walk along is responsible to keep the child close and under control at all times. Groups with walk along or supervised children players must maintain pace of play and are subject to all normal rules and requirements.
- It is recommended that parents with small children or beginners choose off peak playing times to minimize problems. Contact the golf shop for help in choosing the right time.

Weather Policy

Inclement Weather Updates

Call the Highland Springs Pro Shop or the Saukie Pro Shop for inclement weather updates before coming to the course.

Cart Paths

Continuous cart paths are paths that are a continuous loop over all 18 holes. With continuous cart paths, even if the course is extremely wet, carts are restricted to cart paths only and golf will go on. Continuous cart path situations do not allow the carts to be taken from the paths, so in some cases a good deal of walking is also involved.
